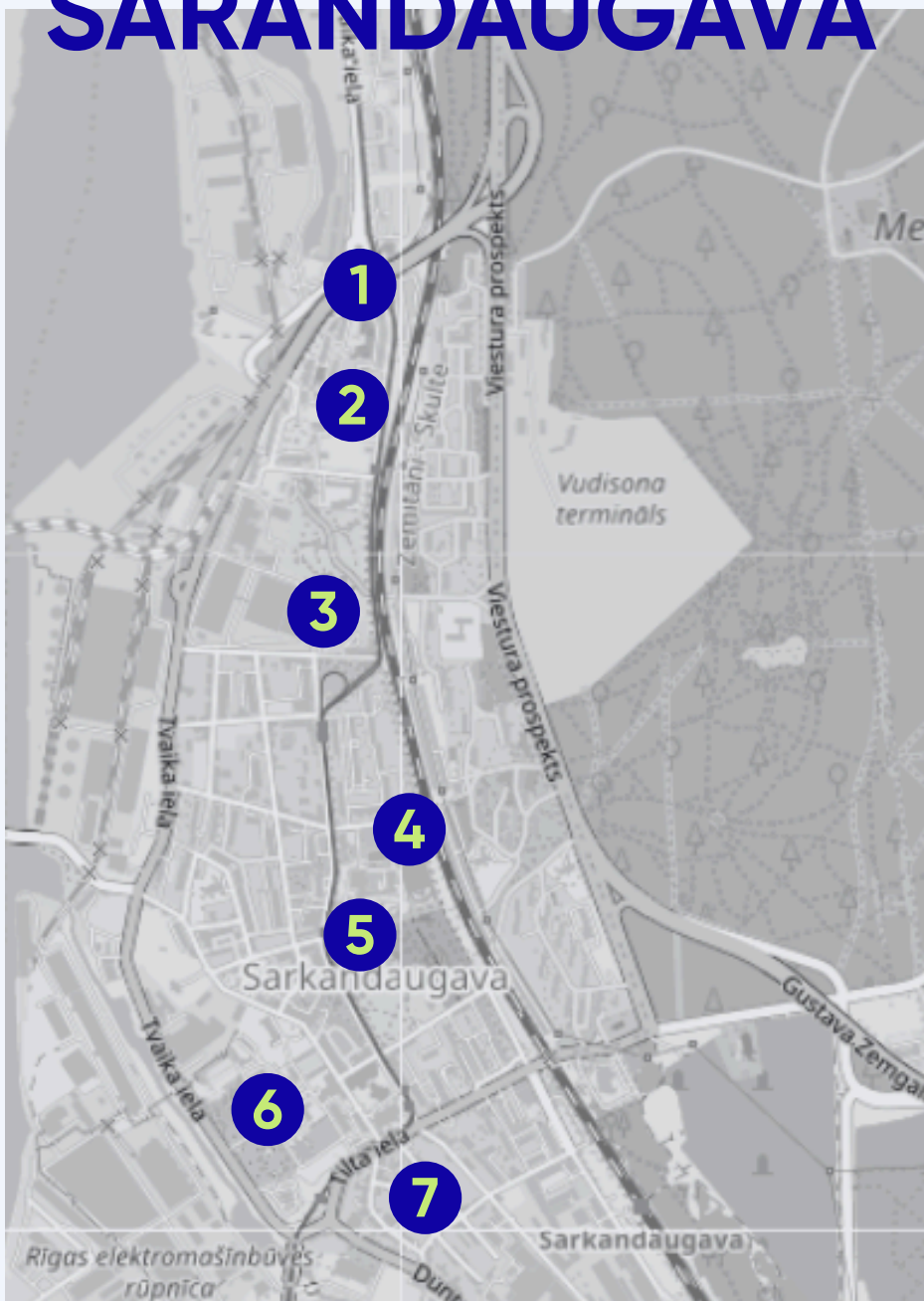


# SARANDAUGAVA



## ATTRACTIONS:

1. **Rails.** A peculiar intersection, where tram and railway tracks meet at the same level - a rare phenomenon in the city, which is due to the proximity of the port and industrial areas. Sliežu iela, under the Daudersala flyover.
2. **Buildings of 1950s.** A complex of apartment buildings, designed as a single ensemble with features of Soviet-era functionalism and modest Stalinism. Sliežu iela 29, Riga, LV-1005
3. **Dauderi.** Originally the mansion of beer industrialist Johann Dauder, it was transformed into the summer residence of President Kārlis Ulmanis in the 1930s. Zāģeru iela 7, Riga, LV-1005.
4. **Tunnel.** A painted railway tunnel is a street art object that transforms the everyday passage under the tracks into a visually intriguing space. This adds a creative touch and makes it more attractive to pedestrians. Limbažu iela 8, Riga, LV-1005
5. **Riga Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church.** A church built at the end of the 19th century, which served the spiritual life of the local community and has preserved its importance to this day. Its architecture is characteristic of the neo-Gothic style. Sarkandaugavas iela 10, Riga, LV-1005.
6. **Birches of the National Centre for Mental Health.** A peaceful green area designed as part of the therapeutic and recreational environment for patients. It is both a scenic and therapeutic element in the hospital complex that creates a quieter and more natural environment in the bustling city. Tvaika iela 2, Riga, LV-1005
7. **Kaķisms (Catism).** The mural is a bright and playful piece of street art, dominated by ironic images of cats. It adds a creative touch to Sarkandaugava. Priežu iela 8, Riga, LV-1005
